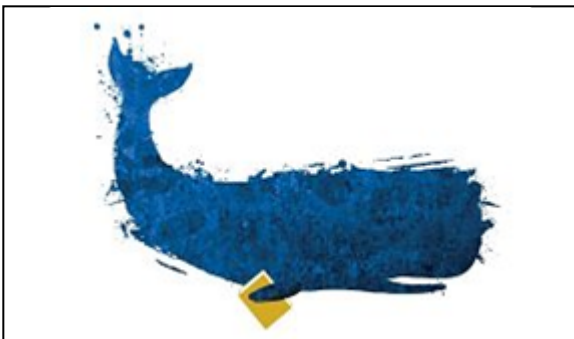

Our Board of Trustees

Meet Coy Library Board Member, Aaron W Dobbs

Aaron Dobbs joined the Coy Public Library of Shippensburg's Board of Trustees in February 2019. He has served on the FUNdraising Committee, the Public Relations Committee, and the Operations Committee; he is currently the Chairperson for the Public Relations Committee and the Operations Committee.

Aaron is the Scholarly Communication Librarian for the Shippensburg University library.



Aaron and family, wife Julie Paddleford and children Natasha and Alena, moved from Clarksville TN to Shippensburg in 2006. Shippensburg is almost exactly halfway (timewise) between Aaron's parents in Western Massachusetts and Julie's parents in East Tennessee. Julie is an IT analyst at Orrstown Bank, and both children attended and graduated from the Shippensburg Area School District.

Everyone in the family has a library card, are active readers, and have both bought books from and donated books to the Book Nook. One of the family pastimes is road trips; a friend of Julie's introduced us to "collecting" US Counties by visiting them -- we've been driven to visit all 3,143 US counties since 1994. Everyone in the family has been to 47 states (AK, HI, ND to go); Julie and Aaron have been to all 67 Pennsylvania counties, Aaron has been to 1,632 US counties (51%), Julie has been to 1,382 (44%), Natasha has been to 1,287 (41%), and Alena has been to 1,257 (40%).
