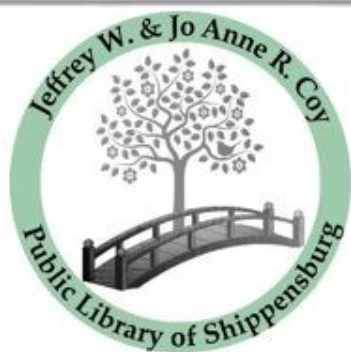

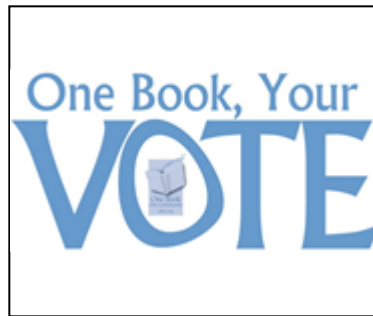

September 26 - October 2, 2021

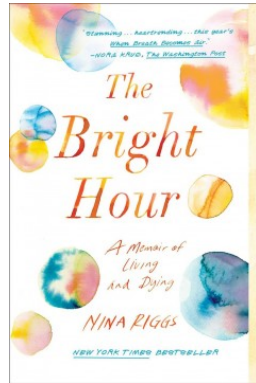
