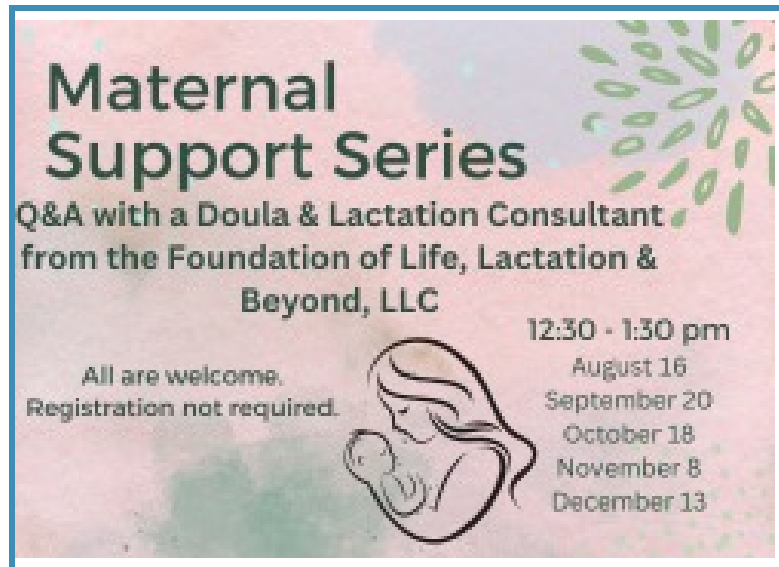

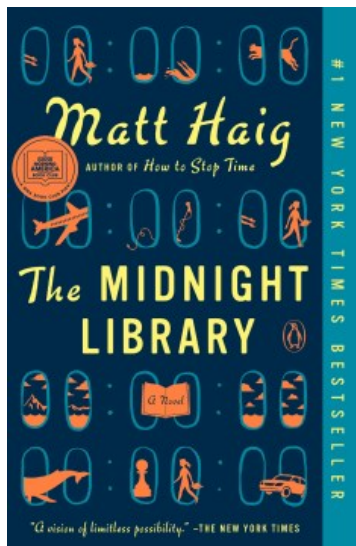


November Book Discussion

Say Hello to a Local Author

Meet Kim Pinzon

She is a local author who's been writing since the age of ten. This gives her 25 years of experience. Four years ago, she began working on her now-published novel "Final Girl Redux." Her inspiration came from an article she'd read criticizing misogyny in horror movies. Kim felt differently about this since she'd grown up with female protagonists such as Ellen Ripley.

Kim spent three years of thorough research into horror movies dating back to 1898 as she dived deeper into the classic troupe of a final girl. Final Girl Redux is a casual deep dive into women's roles in horror films. It's a wonderful casual read that gives a deeper insight into the films we know and love.

Since then, Kim has also published a collection of short horror stories titled "Creeping Shadows" and a YA sci-fi novel, "Through the Mirror." Kim can be found painting, cosplaying, hiking, or gardening when not working on her literary projects. She's also drawn all the covers for her novels!

Her latest project is a futuristic crime thriller that she's aiming to have self-published by 2025.

This is a weekly program for youth ages 10-17 that provides the opportunity to play card games, board games, trivia games, video games, and to socialize with other teens.

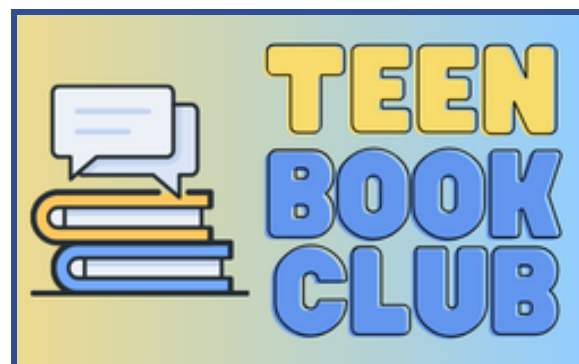
Teen Book Club
